Tabor Construction and Development turned what was once one of Starkville's industrial hubs into a commercial hub.

Borden Dairy closed its condensed milk plant at the corner of Lampkin Street and Montgomery Street in 2005. Four years later, TCD renovated the plant's boiler room into the Central Station Grill, bringing businesses like Something Southern and Boardtown Bikes to the facility in the years since. At the Greater Starkville Development Partnership's annual banquet Jan. 26, GSDP President Jon Maynard spotlighted this achievement.
